READING: We are trying to encourage a love of reading and demonstrate its importance in everyday life, both now and in the future. We would like for all children to read each night and to have their reader cover signed to indicate that they have read.

Hats are not required in Term 2 and students will not need to have them in order to play during recess and lunch.

Homework Schedule

Weekly homework is given out on Monday and daily tasks are as follows:-

Maths: completion of a number facts column (Mon, Tues, Wed, Thurs)

Times Tables: Practice reciting weekly timestables 3 times per night

Reading: 20 to 30 minutes every night

Spelling: Spelling rubric—Students will record words from their fortnightly spelling and practice a range of different tasks.

Students may log on to Studyladder/Essential Assessment, to further enhance their literacy and numeracy skills through games and activities. Log on details will be sent home.

Term 2 Science Unit: — Night and Day

This term in science the class will discover what causes day and night and the relationship between the Sun, Earth and Moon. We will explore:

- *the sizes, shapes, positions and movements of the Sun, Earth and Moon.
- *how shadows change throughout the day based on the Sun's position.
- *how day, night and seasons are caused by the Earth spinning on it's axis.

We have a fantastic excursion to the planetarium at Scienceworks this term, to complement our science
