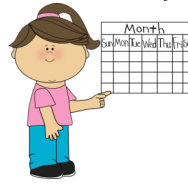


# Y/2 V Term 4 Newsletter

This term, in reading, there will be a focus on making inferences, text-to-text connections, comparing and contrasting, answering hard questions by pointing to the answer in the text and summarising. 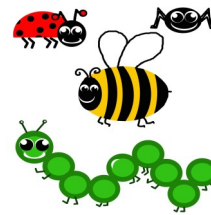
## STUDYLADDER
