

# WELCOME TO 2018!

This year is already shaping up to be a very busy one with some important changes happening to how Child Care across the country is funded. You may have seen some commercials on television about the changes. From 2 July there will be a new Child Care Package. Under the new package, the <u>Child Care Subsidy</u> (CCS) will replace the existing <u>Child Care Benefit</u> and <u>Child Care Rebate</u>. CCS will be the main way the Government assists families with their child care fees. Families should start thinking about how the changes may affect them.

Families currently using child care will be contacted by the Commonwealth Government in early 2018 with more details about the changes. It is important that you read the information provided and check the government website to ensure you are informed and ready. There is also a <u>Family Child Care Subsidy</u>



Estimator available to make it easy for families to get an idea of what their new subsidy might be under the New Child Care Package. The estimator is user-friendly and only takes a few minutes to fill out.
