Our annual Harmony Day Fiesta is scheduled for this Friday 23rd March from 6pm-8pm. Harmony Day is a day to celebrate Australian multiculturalism, based on the successful integration of migrants into our community.

Australia is the most successful multicultural country on earth and we should celebrate this and work to maintain it.

Harmony Day is about inclusiveness of the 29 nationalities within Clarinda PS, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of cultural or linguistic background, united by a set of core Australian values.

## TEACHER PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE DAYS

In the Education State, we achieve excellence by consistently focusing on improving the achievements of learners across Victoria, whether it is through improving the quality of educational services or changing the way we teach.

The most important thing we can do to improve student outcomes is to develop and improve the skills of our teachers.

The Victorian Government will continue to provide opportunities to develop professional, passionate teachers and principals and equip them with the right knowledge and skills to meet the needs of their students.

To ensure we support the learning and development of not only our students, but our teachers too; we are committed to providing professional development opportunities for our teacher workforce.

Teachers will spend four days per year further developing their skills in areas that are aligned to the school priorities. Students will directly benefit from these improvements in their daily learning.

All of our teachers will be taking time to improve their delivery of teaching and learning through the professional practice days during Term 1, 2, 3 and 4.

The professional practice days are part of the Victorian Government Schools Agreement 2017. Each full time teacher is entitled to one day per term (four days per year), to focus on the improved delivery of high quality teaching and learning.

We know children sometimes find it challenging when their teacher is away from the classroom.

Equally, it's important that teachers take the time to focus on improving their professional practice because their learning directly impacts on your child's learning experience.

There is a learning plan in place to ensure that your child's education continues as usual.

We are scheduling the days ahead of time and have planned the day so that there is minimal impact.



The most recent project was on the Gold Rush.

The students were asked to choose an aspect of the Gold Rush they wanted to research, whether it be Life on the Goldfields, Influential people on the Gold Fields, or the history of Gold Discovery in Australia and present it any way they wanted to their peers.
