It is important to note that NAPLAN is a snapshot of were students are performing at the time of the test and is just one aspect of the schools assessment and reporting. NAPLAN test results are used by the school to discuss student progress, additional support, and strengths and weaknesses in the teaching program.


District Cross Country


