Professional Practice Days (PPD)

Over the coming weeks, teaching staff will be absent from daily teaching instruction in the classroom. As part of the Department of Education and Training initiatives from the commencement of the 2018 school year each teacher is entitled to one day per term (four days per year, pro rata for a teacher employed part time) released from their scheduled duties, including teaching, to focus on the improved delivery of high quality teaching and learning.

The work undertaken on these days must be consistent with Departmental and school priorities and selected from the following areas: planning, preparation, assessment of student learning, collaboration, curriculum development, relevant professional development and peer observation including feedback and reflection.

We will endeavour to keep disruptions to minimum during the PPD.

The school was involved in a 3rd practice Emergency Management drill today. We evacuated from the main school ground to the basketball courts across the road on the Elder Street Oval.

All students completed the drill in a timely manner and I was very proud of their behaviour.

Victorian Police area Inspector that Clarinda was within one of the safest Government areas in Victoria. VicPolice Highway Patrol also presented on the 5 main causes of accidents which include; Speed, Fatigue, Distraction, Seat Belts and Impaired Drivers. It was a great 2 hours to connect with our community.
