

The 2018 National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) results for Year 3 and 5 students will be available on Thursday August 30th. The results of the NAPLAN tests provide diagnostic information for parents and teachers about a child's performance in Literacy and Numeracy. This information is used to support our teaching and learning programs and improve student achievement. Please remember that the NAPLAN tests are just a 'snapshot' of student performance and are conducted under test

conditions within short timelines in May. Parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher should they have any questions about the results.

Dear school community,

This week, parents and carers should have received my first "official" communication where I encourage you to contact local politicians and speak out on behalf of the school and its students. We should use every mean available to make a very clear and audible case for a significant school upgrade. When we unite as one, we have a much louder voice. Of course these things don't happen overnight, but I ask you to act to support the initiatives of our staff leadership team and help get Clarinda Primary noticed and on the list for a review of our facilities. The more often we ask, the better our chances of being allocated funding. Local MP Heang Tak suggested we lobby local government offices for attention and I hope you will all join me in filling his mailbox: a letter from every family in the school will go a long way towards drawing attention to our needs and start the ball rolling.

Looking internally, in the same way that the junior school council members convene to discuss classroom hot topics, I would like to encourage our adult community to do the same. Anyone is welcome to attend our monthly council meetings although non-elected members are not able to vote when this is required. 


