Please remember to arrive on time. As you can appreciate our days are very busy and the day is timetabled to maximise teaching and learning time. The first bell rings at **8:50am**, and this is the start of our day.



Purple Folders

Please continue to check and empty the Purple Communication Folder each night and return to school each morning.

Don't forget that you are able to communicate with your child's teacher by sending a **message on ClassDojo** or **planning a time to meet** with your child's teacher. Also, a reminder that student absences from school must be reported directly to the school office (call 9544 3231) not sent via ClassDojo.

At home reading

Please continue to hear your child **read their take home book and practise the Alphabet or Magic 100 Words every night.**

The children are progressing through the Magic Words and receiving certificates when they have achieved each list.

Just a reminder that your children can be tested once per week, when they bring their folder to school, but will be tested a minimum of once per fortnight.



Strategies your child can use to help them read new words are:

Eagle Eye – looking at the picture clues

Lips the Fish – look at the first sound of the word

Stretchy Snake – stretch and blend the sounds in the word

Chunky Monkey – break big words up into smaller chunks

Don't forget! **Reading Circles** is each morning at 8:50am, and we need lots of parents to attend. If you would like to volunteer please present a valid Working with Children Check to the school office.

REMINDERS

Hats are not required in Term 2 and 3. We will wear hats at school again in Term 4.

No nuts are allowed at school. As we have children at Clarinda who are highly allergic to peanuts (anaphylactic) and other nuts, we strongly recommend no nuts including all spreads such as **Nutella** and **Peanut butter** and any other products that may contain nuts. We know you will assist us and take care when preparing your child's snacks and lunches. Please also talk to your children about not sharing food with others when at school.



Play is the Way

This we are beginning a new school-wide behaviour education program called 'Play is the Way'. We will spend a few weeks focussing on different core virtues that helps us govern our own behaviour.

To begin with, we are all learning the Golden Rule:

Treat others as you would like them to treat you.
