Make sure you're connected to your child's Class Dojo as it's a great way to keep up to date with what's happening in the classroom.



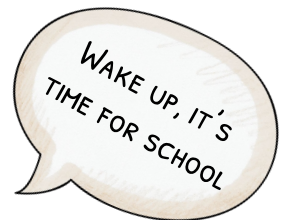
It's also fantastic to connect with your child's learning and communicate with myself.

Homework will be given out on a Monday, and is due the following Monday.

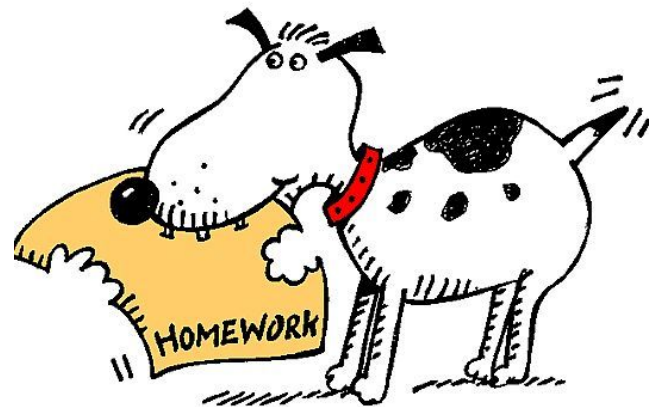
Weekly homework consists of:
