

Homework

Number facts should continue to be practised each night, and the sheets brought back to school every Friday. The reading and spelling of the sight vocabulary in the reader covers should also be practised on a regular basis.



Reading

This term will see a continued focus on the teaching of specific reading strategies in order to improve levels of comprehension. There will be a focus on Author's Purpose (Persuade, Inform & Entertain) and making text-to-self and text-to-text connections.

Furthermore, the children will be immersed in our Poetry Unit. They will be reading and writing various poems that include acrostic, shape, cinquain and free verse/rhyme.

It is vital that the children read daily at home and are encouraged for their efforts. We would also like to encourage all families to visit their local library and borrow books regularly to support literacy development.

STEM

In Term 3 students will be exploring the topic 'Push and Pull' and 'Transport'.

Students will be exposed to the processes of push and pull and will be constructing their own transport to demonstrate the concepts and skills learnt throughout the term. There will be a note going home for the collection of cardboard containers and plastic bottle tops. Students will prepare for and rehearse their talks at school this term; they will present their transport creation to the class towards the end of term.

Writing



The Grade 1s and 2s have been very fortunate to take part in the Little Scribe's Writing Festival. They have been listening and working with authors and learning how to improve their writing.

Students will continue to develop their knowledge of the '6+1 Traits of Writing' through the Writer's Workshop. Students will be writing a fiction text and poetry by using the writing process (planning, drafting, revising, editing and publishing.)



Mathematics

This term we will cover a range of topics in Mathematics. Some of the topics will include money, time, calendar, mass, 3D shapes, transformation (flip, slide and turn), multiplication, division, fractions and graphs.



PMP

Grade 1 children will be involved in the Perceptual Motor Program (PMP) every other Thursday. The aim of the Perceptual Motor Program is to enhance the coordination of the students through their participation in a variety of appropriate physical activities. Parental support is essential. Please ensure you have a current Working with Children's Check if you would like to assist. We couldn't run the program without your support.



Grade 2 children will be involved in Sport during this time.

However, due to current restrictions, this is to be confirmed.

Play is the Way

Children will continue exploring our program 'Play is the Way'. This is a practical methodology for teaching social and emotional skills using guided play, classroom activities and an empowering self-reflective language.
