#### **Reading**

It is vital that you continue to listen to your child **read their take** home book and revise the M100 words/alphabet every night.

As your child continues to make progress in their reading, it is a good idea to help them develop their comprehension skills by asking them questions about the book once they finish reading. Please ensure you revise all the words on all the coloured cards as your child progresses to new levels to reinforce their learning. We also encourage you to continue making use of Reading Eggs at home. You have already received your login details but please let us know if you need assistance accessing this program.

#### Writing

Your child will be learning about features of Non Fiction texts and will be taught how to incorporate this features into their writing. You might like to inspire their interest in non fiction books at home and borrow some from your local library. Later this term we will look at poetry and rhyme in our reading and writing workshops.

## <u>Maths</u>

This term your child will learn about multiplication and division, place value, money and 2D and 3D shapes. We will continue to consolidate counting forwards and backwards by 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s. Your child will also learn directional language such as above, below, next to, behind. Please ask if you would like more information about the vocabulary we will be using this term.

## <u>Science</u>

This term our Chemical Science unit of study is called "What's It Made Of?" and our students will examine the materials used to make objects found in the school environment. They will also investigate various materials for water resistance properties.

## <u>Tissues</u>

We are asking once again that all children bring along a box of tissues for the grade to use for term 3.

## <u>No nuts</u>
