Speech Pathologist

We will welcome Ms. Indra Kreismanis back the school in 2022 as a Speech. Pathologist. Indra will work for one day a week supporting our Education Support (ES) Staff. All of our staff have received training in the Speech Therapy Assistant program. This program is designed to support all Tier 3 and Tier 2 children requiring intervention or additional support.



Final Prep Transition Day

A celebration will be held on Tuesday 7th December to acknowledge the final transition day for our 2022 Prep students. We currently have 53 children enrolled with 3 classes of approx. 17 children in each class. The small class sizes will provide a fantastic opportunity for transitioning into the first year of schooling.

Vaccination Requirements

In line with the Department of Education (DET Operations Guide):

Vaccinated and unvaccinated parents/carers may enter the school grounds to drop off or collect their child.

Unvaccinated parents/carers cannot stay and 'mingle' with on-site guests at the school.

Vaccinated parents/carers will be permitted to enter the school building for the *Graduation Ceremony* once they have Checked-in via a QR Code and presented their vaccination certificate. Entry/Exit will be via Gate 3 on the evening.

Unvaccinated parents/carers cannot enter the school building or remain on school grounds for the *Graduation Ceremony*.

Please note following DET guidelines we require all attendees to follow the below restrictions:

- All attendees will need to have proof (digital or physical certificate required) of full vaccination
- Attendees must wear masks while indoors unless exempt
- Sit socially distanced in the hall
- Sign in and out using the Services Victoria QR codes to check-in




