Vaccination Requirements

In line with the Department of Education (DET Operations Guide):

- Vaccinated and unvaccinated parents/carers may enter the school grounds to drop off or collect their child.
- Unvaccinated parents/carers cannot stay and 'mingle' with on-site guests at the school.
- Vaccinated parents/carers will be permitted to enter the school building for the Graduation Ceremony once they have Checked-in via a QR Code and presented their vaccination certificate. Entry/Exit will be via Gate 3 on the evening.
- Unvaccinated parents/carers cannot enter the school building or remain on school grounds for the Graduation Ceremony.

Uniform


I would like to take this opportunity to remind our community about the requirement of compliance to the school Uniform Policy.

Our main issue regarding lack of compliancy is directly related to choice of footwear. While most children wear the required black shoes, many wear partly black or completely different coloured shoes which do not fit in with uniform policy.

Many of you will need to consider 'new' uniforms for growing children before the start of the next school year. Most of you would probably need to upgrade your child's footwear before next year. I kindly remind you that the shoes must be totally black in colour.

Any student not wearing the required uniform will be required to have a written note by their parent explaining why they are out of uniform. We understand that there will be times that clothes are in the wash and we also understand that the current pair of shoes may have been bought recently.

We ask that the very next purchase of shoes be black to comply with our school uniform.
