FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

The World Around Us

I do trust this fortnight's newsletter finds you and your family well.

Thank you for the care you are showing each other by keeping your children home when they are unwell and by undertaking the rapid antigen tests twice a week. Over recent weeks, we have seen a number of events of a distressing nature both in Australia and abroad. We would like to extend our thoughts to any of our families that have connections with people experiencing the recent floods impacting on QLD and NSW.

The conflict and associated tension impacting the Ukraine is making the news and the media a distressing event. Such is the nature of social media and journalism in our current environment, much of this reporting is occurring in the midst of conflict, the proliferation of distressing images and videos makes it difficult to ignore.

We encourage you to speak with your child and/or monitor what they are watching. Recent images and stories may have an impact on individual households or our broader school community. Please reach out if you or your child needs support. At times it is very difficult to understand what is happening in our world as an adult, much less a young child.

NAPLAN Co-ordinated Practice Test

Today, all students in Gr 3 and 5 participated in a nationwide Practice Test.

The purpose of the session was to test the internet and device capability within the school and nationally.

Each child was involved in a practice test that does not contribute to their 2022 NAPLAN performance.

NAPLAN is scheduled from 10^{th} - 20^{th} May 2022. Information has been sent home today.

With a clear link to the previous message and the current environment, the school will be celebrating Harmony Day on the 31st March. Recognising that our school, surrounding suburbs, Melbourne and indeed Australia is a richer environment for celebrating the diverse backgrounds that families bring to our country. Children are required to bring a loose change to form 'Flood Lines'. Money raised will be donated to the NSW and QLD flood relief.

Students are encouraged to wear traditional clothing or the colour orange.

Some facts that may generate some interesting discussion in our classrooms and at home:

- Over the past 70 years, more than seven and a half million migrants have made Australia home.
- Almost half of Australians were either born overseas or have a parent who was.
- We identify with around 300 ancestries
- Orange is the colour chosen to represent Harmony Week. Traditionally, orange signifies social communication and meaningful conversations.
- Australia is one of the most successful multicultural countries in the world.

Covid Guidelines

Once again, thank you kindly for supporting the school and testing your child and notifying the school in the event of a positive test. We encourage you to monitor your child and consider keeping your child at home if any symptoms become apparent. We have had a number of positive cases and we are aiming to keep our school community informed as quickly as we can in the event of this occurring.

Please note, whilst the Department of Education and Training has confirmed the availability of RA tests until the end of Term 1. As soon as these are provided to the school we organise to have them sent home on a Friday. Once again, your support over the last few months has allowed us to continue to keep our students in classrooms and learning whilst also providing exciting opportunities like camps, incursions, excursions and sporting events. We greatly appreciate your support.

As part of our Emergency Management Plan, we perform numerous scenarios throughout the school year to ensure staff and students are familiar with expectations of emergency events. Next Tuesday, every person on the school grounds at 12:50pm will participate in an evacuation to the oval.

Annual Report to School Community

The Annual Report to the school community will be presented on Tuesday 5th April as part of our School Council meeting.

The Annual Report is designed to add value in a number of ways:

Keeping the school community informed:

The annual report provides a means for the school council to inform the community of what has been achieved and how the school is performing. Providing information about schools helps the community hold schools, the system and government accountable for improving student outcomes.

* Contributing to system accountability and meeting legislative requirements:

Public accountability for improving student outcomes and for the use of public money is mandated in the Education and Training Reform Act (2006), where school councils are required to prepare and publish an annual report.

- Relationship between the planning and annual reporting processes: The development of the annual report is an opportunity to reflect on the school's achievements and use this as a basis for future planning.
- Annual Report to the School Community

Schools are required to submit an annual report to the school community school (annual report) to the Department each year. The annual report informs parents, and the wider school community, of the school's successes, activities and achievements throughout the year. It also meets legislative and regulatory requirements under the Education and Training Reform Act 2006 and the National Education Agreement 2008.

Preparing the annual report is an important opportunity for schools to reflect on their achievements and use this as a basis for future planning.



Parent and Community Club (PACC) - change of date

The first meeting of the year is scheduled for Wednesday 30th March at 2:30pm.

For those unable to attend on-site, a WebEx link will be sent prior to the meeting.

Parents' clubs (alternatively called parents' associations) promote the welfare of, and provide support to, the school and its community. Parents are key partners in their child's learning. By interacting with the school and other parents, parents' club members can use their skills and experience to work collaboratively with others in supporting the school and its students, and build a sense of community within the school.

The role of a parents' club is threefold:

- to provide support, in various forms, for the school, its students and community, including raising funds for the benefit of the school
- to work in cooperation with the principal, staff and school council in building effective partnerships between home and school
- to encourage diversity by getting to know the parents of other children at the school, and to support the operation of the school

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- · \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- · new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
