FROM THE PRINCIPALS DESK

PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE DAYS

The New Victorian Government Schools Agreement provides for three Professional Practice Days in 2022, two in 2023 and in 2024 and subsequent school years. These Professional Practice Days are in addition to existing pupil free days and planning time, pro rata for part-time teachers and can be rescheduled by agreement. On professional practice days teachers are to be

released from their scheduled duties, including teaching, to focus on the improved delivery of high quality teaching and learning.

The work undertaken on these days will be consistent with Departmental and school priorities and selected from the following areas: planning, preparation, assessment of student learning, collaboration, curriculum development, relevant professional development and peer observation including feedback and reflection.

The Agreement provides that the timing and focus of the Professional Practice days will be nominated by each teacher and agreed in consultation with the principal.

Where the timing and/or focus are not agreed, the timing will be determined by the principal and the focus of the day will be determined by the teacher and must be consistent with the focus areas set out above.

Principals should ensure that the professional practice day entitlement for teachers for 2022 and ongoing is facilitated.

Information Regarding 2026 Term dates and Commonwealth Games- Forward Planning

There have been changes to Victorian school term dates for 2026. This will provide an opportunity for Victorian communities to participate more broadly in the 2026 Commonwealth Games.

The 2026 Commonwealth Games will take place across regional Victoria from Tuesday 17 March to Sunday 29 March 2026, with Geelong, Bendigo, Ballarat, Gippsland and Shepparton hosting a range of activities and events for 20 different sports and 9 para-sports. Term 3: Monday 6 July to Friday 18 September 2026

Term 4: Monday 5 October to Friday 18 December 2026.

On behalf of our community, I would also like thank the PACC for their ongoing support of the school. Karen Vasilaras, Rebecca Mandile, Kelly Kowalewski and Shaun Doolan for leading the PACC.

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Throughout the year they have been supported by many of our parents/grandparents at a variety of events. To date they have raised \$22,782 for the 'Raise the Playground' project.

Victoria-wide single-use plastics ban - from 1 February 2023

Single-use plastics make up a third of the litter in our environment and are difficult and costly to clean up. They pollute the environment, harming wildlife and contaminating our food and water. They are also a poor use of resources – they are often used for only a few minutes and generate significant waste that is not recyclable

They can often easily be replaced with reusable products.

Under new regulations, from 1 February 2023, Victorian businesses and organisations (including schools) will not be able to sell, supply or provide a number of single-use plastic items.

The ban applies to the following single-use plastic items made from conventional, degradable or compostable plastics:

- Drinking straws
- Cutlery including knives, forks, spoons, chopsticks, sporks, splades, food picks and sporks
- Plates
- Drink stirrers and sticks
- Cotton bud sticks

The ban also applies to:

• Food service items and drink containers made from expanded polystyrene. This includes expanded polystyrene plates, cups, bowls, clam shells and any cover or lid that is also made from expanded polystyrene.

Clarinda Primary School will be implementing the Victorian government's single-use plastics ban in the items we use as a school community including at OSHC, catering at fundraising events, classroom and staffroom activities and other school events etc.

We will not be using any banned single-use plastic items from 1 February 2023.

Exceptions to the ban

People who need single-use plastic drinking straws due to a disability or for a medical need will still be able to purchase and use these items. If your child needs to continue using single-use plastic drinking straws because of a disability or medical need, please let Mr Mallett know and we will ensure that there is a supply available for your child's use at future school activities.

The Victorian government has produced a useful <u>Fact Sheet</u> explaining which items are banned and which are not, including information about exemptions.

Student lunches and snacks from home

Welcome to the family

Offences relating to the ban do not apply to private or domestic activities at home, e.g. individual families' decisions about lunch packaging.

The intention of the government's new regulations is to remove these items from the supply chain prior to reaching the customer.

At Clarinda Primary School we already encourage no packaging or single use plastics in food brought from home, also promote 'nude food' days, and are implementing sustainability practices and policy.
