School Maintenance

Clarinda PS has a great campus for our students and the whole community to enjoy. One of the challenges of having such a big campus is the ongoing maintenance required to keep it in good shape. Rarely a week goes by where we are not engaging a trade in maintenance work around the campus.

During the school holidays we had important repair work to steps around the school. A GaGa Pit has been installed and been an instantaneous winner with many students using the new space. The synthetic grass in the middle of the school is currently being restored to ensure a quality surface. Over the coming weeks, trees will be pruned with an audit to take place from a contracted arborist.

School Uniform Reminders

Sun Smart ends at the start of May, but please be aware of the weather, which can be variable at this time of year. Hopefully we will still get some sunny days, and if so then a sun smart hat is a wise choice. The UV rays can still be just as strong as in summer.

As we head into the colder months lost property becomes a big challenge, with students often misplacing their jackets or windcheaters. Having these items of clothing clearly labelled is vital, as they can quickly be returned to their owner. We are sometimes surprised to see near new jackets in the lost property box without being labelled.

For girls who prefer to wear a school dress they must wear navy/black leggings rather than track pants under the dress. Wet weather jackets are OK, but they are not a replacement for a bomber jacket or windcheater.

Thanks in advance for assisting us to meet our uniform policy. We believe it's a fair and practical policy that offer lots of choices, without having unrealistic expectations. This policy is well supported by our uniform shop that is run for the benefit of everyone in our school community. Many schools no longer offer a uniform shop on-site and we are grateful to office staff for providing this service. It also means that our uniforms are a good deal cheaper, as we sell them at the wholesale price we pay for them.

Professional Practice Day (PPD)

As teachers are lifelong learners and continue to reflect and refine their practice they are entitled to two Professional Practice Days in 2023. The work undertaken on these days will be consistent with Departmental and school priorities and selected from the following areas: planning, preparation, assessment of student learning, collaboration, curriculum development, relevant professional development and peer observation including feedback and reflection.

A PPD is scheduled for **Tuesday 30th May**. Students do not attend school for this day. Camp Australia will be offering alternative care for the day. Please ensure you book early to ensure you have care for your child.

Staff will be working on Assessment and Reporting to ensure school reports are ready for the end of Semester 1.

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Clarinda Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved

the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 8 September 2023.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

CPS loves SPELLING

In 2023, Clarinda Primary School teachers are working on their knowledge and instructional practices in spelling.

We have worked closely with Danny Hyndman, educational consultant, to look at the many different aspects of spelling: phonology, morphology, orthography and etymology. We will continue to focusing on building our own knowledge in this area throughout the year.

As part of this learning, we are discovering some very INTERESTING things about the English language!

It is a varied language, growing and changing over the years through creating and changing words, words being mistakenly said, and borrowing words from lots of different cultures and countries.

There are so many weird and wonderful reasons why English is the way it is, so this year in our school newsletters we are going to have a little spotlight on spelling to share some of the things we have learnt.

This will be called a...

SPELLING: Did you know...?

Why is there a "w" in the word TWO (2)?

The word **two** (the number 2) comes from the Old English 'twa' and 'twegen' (then 'twain') – however these days we don't pronounce the letter 'W'!

So why is it still there?

The 'w' in two shows its connection to other words meaning two, including: twins (two people), twice (two-times), twenty (two lots of 10), twelve (10 plus two more) and between (in the middle of two).

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


