Parent and Carer feedback is crucial in shaping the future of our school and ensuring that we continue to provide the best possible educational opportunities for our students while staying true to our school's DNA.

Hats

As per our Sunsmart Policy, as of 1st September, we transition back into hat wearing within the school yard at recess and lunchtimes. Sunsmart Victoria outline that:

UV levels reach 3 or higher daily from mid-August to the end of April.

Students will have the last 2 weeks of term to transition to wearing hats. It will be expected that students wear their hats daily from the start of Term 4, failure to do so will mean they have to spend time under cover near the LOTE rooms.

2024 Enrolments for 3 and 4 year old programs

As per my previous comments, now is the time to start enrolling your child for Links and Stepping Up for 2024. Over the last three years we have averaged roughly 20 applications for enrolment in Stepping Up and it is important for us to be able to plan for these programs. Enrolment forms can be collected from the office.

Defibrillator

Our 'Defib' is located next to the staffroom and fish tank. We hope that we never have to use this, however, it is very reassuring to know that we have available if any member of our school or local community requires this.

DEFIBRILLATORS SAVE LIVES

Why you need a Defibrillator during a sudden cardiac arrest:

- Defibrillation within the first few minutes of having a Sudden Cardiac Arrest increases the chance of survival to over 70%
- Without early defibrillation with an AED, less than 5% of cardiac arrest victims survive
- Without defibrillation, for every minute that passes, the chance of survival reduces by 10%
- Average Victorian ambulance response times are approximately 8-10 minutes in metro areas and up to 30 minutes in regional areas - defibrillation in combination with CPR gives victims the best chance of survival when waiting for Ambulance to arrive

For the parents - Developing oral language / Questions & Answers.




