It is great to see everyone back at school for a busy and exciting term! Grade 6s have their final weeks in Primary School and Grade 5s have a term getting ready to be the school leaders in 2024!

In our Reading and Writing Workshops this term, we are doing an Author Study on Jackie French, the author of some amazing picture story books (Fire, Flood, Cyclone) and historical fiction novels (Fair Dinkum Histories). Our aim is to write a picture story book to resemble Jackie French's style. Later on in the term, we will be investigating a multimodal unit of Literacy where the students will be selecting their own mode in which they would like to communicate their writing.

In Maths we are focusing on Measurement, Capacity and Volume as well as looking at different types of maps and how to read them. We are also learning about Civics and Citizenship and how the Australian Government works.
