FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

School tours for 2025 enrolments have commenced, and something we take for granted but noticed by our visitors is the calm classrooms and orderly environments.

Good classroom management is a strong skill of the teachers at CPS and is critical for success. One thing all teachers (and adults) want is for our children to learn to manage their own behaviour. By teaching thinking tools and organisational strategies, the students learn to take control and responsibility for their learning.

As stated in our Student Engagement and Wellbeing Policy: 'All members of our school community have a right to experience a safe and supportive school environment. We expect that all students, staff, parents and carers treat each other with respect and dignity. Our school's Statement of Values highlights the rights and responsibilities of members of our community.

Students have the right to:

- participate fully in their education
- feel safe, secure and happy at school
- learn in an environment free from bullying,
- harassment, violence, discrimination or intimidation express their ideas, feelings and concerns.

every day. Punctuality is an important life skill and a great habit to form early in life. Students ideally should arrive at school around 8:40am, which allows enough time to enjoy a quick catch up with friends before the preparation bell at 8:50am. At 8:40am, a teacher is on 'yard duty' and therefore supervision is provided from this time onwards. We are concerned by the number of students arriving at school without a parent as early as 8:10am! Whilst we understand that some parents have work commitments that require them to leave for work earlier than 8:40am you need to plan for your child. Camp Australia offers an excellent Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) program to support our families.

- Emergency Evacuation Drill Thursday 21st March @ 12:30pm

 As part of our Emergency Management Plan, we perform numerous scenarios throughout the school year to ensure staff and students are familiar with expectations of emergency events. Today, every person on the school grounds at 12:30pm participated in an evacuation to the oval.
- Traffic Safety: A reminder that Eulinga Road and Crawford Road 'Kiss and Go' parking requires parents to stay with their cars at all times. Even though the school year is young, we cannot help but notice the amount of times parents ignore the signage around the school, particularly stopping in no-standing areas near driveways and street corners. The signs are there to ensure the safety of the students in our care and it's not good enough to simply ignore them by thinking you'll only be stopped for a minute. It obscures the sight lines of pedestrians and drivers alike and puts members of the community at risk. Please note: the school has no control over parking fines, but we do know that council officers patrol from time to time.
- End Term 1: Assembly will be held on the synthetic grassed area from 9:10am on Thursday 28th March. If the weather is inclement, a WebEx link will be sent via Compass on the morning.


Premiers Annual Reading Challenge

Fun for Wellbeing




