Our Term 1 Improvement Cycle

Our staff have undertaken considerable professional learning during Term 1 including formal professional learning and reflective opportunities to promote consistent instructional approaches in our classrooms. Miss Ziebell and Mrs Borland lead the school in the delivery of:

- Goal Setting and Coaching
- Why Norms and creating Norms
- Writing Moderation (including Rubrics)
- Single Word Spelling Test (SWST analysis)
- Spelling Cycles

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School Maintenance / Upgrades

Clarinda PS has a great campus for our students and the whole community to enjoy. One of the challenges of having such a big campus is the ongoing maintenance required to keep it in good shape. Rarely a week goes by where we are not engaging a trade in maintenance work around the campus.

During the school holidays we had important repair work on:

- Steps to the portable on the oval
- Roof replacement on the admin building
- Roof repairs on the Gallery and LOTE rooms
- Replacement of weather boards and painting the western side of the hall
- Demolition and rebuilding of the PE shed including new shelving
- Centenary Garden restoration
- New gate to the chicken coup
- 90% completion of the Power Supply upgrade
- High Priority tree work

Some of this work has been covered by the Department of Education. However, the majority of work has been funded through school resources. Voluntary payment of school fees allows for the school council to plan these projects. When Voluntary payments are not received, we are required to exhaust funds (used to cover stationary, device leases) that have been previously targeted for school upgrades.

Sun Smart ends at the start of May, but please be aware of the weather, which can be variable at this time of year. Hopefully we will still get some sunny days, and if so then a sun smart hat is a wise choice. The UV rays can still be just as strong as in summer.

As we head into the colder months lost property becomes a big challenge, with students often misplacing their jackets or windcheaters. Having these items of clothing clearly labelled is vital, as they can quickly be returned to their owner. We are sometimes surprised to see near new jackets in the lost property box without being labelled.

For girls who prefer to wear a school dress they must wear navy/black leggings rather than track pants under the dress. Wet weather jackets are OK, but they are not a replacement for a bomber jacket or windcheater.

Thanks in advance for assisting us to meet our uniform policy. We believe it's a fair and practical policy that offer lots of choices, without having unrealistic expectations. This policy is well supported by our uniform shop that is run for the benefit of everyone in our school community. Many schools no longer offer a uniform shop on-site and we are grateful to office staff for providing this service. It also means that our uniforms are a good deal cheaper, as we sell them at the wholesale price we pay for them.




