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
Covid has certainly played a part in the downturn, but this is a nationwide trend that goes back to 2015. School refusal is on the rise and many experts argue that this is due to the impact of social media on young people.

We understand that life brings challenges, but we also know how important it is for children to be at school. Attending school is a critical part of a young person's development and in some cases, students are up to 2 years behind on the developmental continuum due to missing out on vital social interactions in their early years. The affect that this has on learning and future socialisation is enormous and missing more school is not the answer.

Strong student attendances are directly linked to student achievement and social development.

Our goal is to reduce the number of students missing 20 or more days per year from the current 40%, to less than 30% over the next 4 years. Our staff are working very hard to develop engaging activities and provide support to students, but we also acknowledge that there are some school tasks that just need to be done, because it's in each student's best interests. In short, we need the help of parents to reduce absenteeism.

Please, if your child is healthy, we implore you to make sure that they are at school.



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
#### Curriculum Day -Monday 28th April

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






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
NAPLAN Reading (latest year) Year 5


