School Uniform Reminders

Sun Smart ends at the start of May, but please be aware of the weather, which can be variable at this time of year. Hopefully we will still get some sunny days, and if so then a sun smart hat is a wise choice. The UV rays can still be just as strong as in summer.

As we head into the colder months lost property becomes a big challenge, with students often misplacing their jackets or windcheaters. Having these items of clothing clearly labelled is vital, as they can quickly be returned to their owner. We are sometimes surprised to see near new jackets in the lost property box without being labelled.

For girls who prefer to wear a school dress they must wear navy/black leggings rather than track pants under the dress. Wet weather jackets are OK, but they are not a replacement for a bomber jacket or windcheater.

Thanks in advance for assisting us to meet our uniform policy, which can be viewed on our school website. We believe it's a fair and practical policy that offer lots of choices, without having unrealistic expectations. This policy is well supported by our uniform shop that is run for the benefit of everyone in our school community. It also means that our uniforms are a good deal cheaper, as we sell them at the wholesale price we pay for them.

Curriculum Day

As part of ongoing professional development, our staff were fortunate to work with the Therapeutic Engagement Support Services on Monday 28th April. During this day the staff were updated with the latest research on Department of Education Restraint and Seclusion policies. The staff learnt about core behaviour responses and de-escalation skills. It was a valuable day of learning for all.

Why going to school is important

Going to school every day is an important part of your child's education. Children and young people learn new things at school every day, connect with friends, have fun and develop good habits that help them to succeed after school. Attending and participating in school will help your child:

- develop important skills and knowledge to help them learn
- develop social and emotional skills such as good communication, resilience and team work
- establish friendships with peers which help develop self-esteem and a sense of belonging.

There is no safe number of days for missing school. Being away from school for 1 day a fortnight adds up to missing 4 whole weeks of school a year. Where possible, you should avoid your child missing school, for example, make appointments for your child outside of school hours and keep family holidays to outside term time.

If your child is sick or absent you should let the school know as soon as possible and tell them why your child can't come to school. It may be by phone, email or via Compass.

If you do not let the school know, we will contact you to make sure your child is safe.

As a parent/carer, you are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day, and if an absence is required, you must provide an explanation. If your child has frequent unexplained absences then their school will work with you to implement appropriate supports to assist your child and ensure they attend school every day and remain at school during school hours.

Tips to help improve your child's attendance

- Talk to your child about school and how important it is. You can ask them
 how they feel about school, what they like and if there are any problems.
- Encourage and celebrate good attendance habits with your child, including arriving to school on time every day.
- Set a good example. Show them how you keep to your own commitments.
- Encourage your child to take on hobbies that they enjoy such as sports and clubs. This will help them develop positive relationships outside of the classroom setting.
- Help your child maintain daily routines such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Help them pack their school bag the night before with everything they need.
- Have a set time for breakfast.
- Plan to meet up with a friend so they can travel to school together.

If ever your family needs support in this area, please don't hesitate to reach out to the school as we have many connections with community services and well being supports in the school.







