## A Visit from the Deputy Premier and Minister for Education

On Tuesday, Clarinda Primary School had the honour of welcoming the Deputy Premier and Minister for Education, Mr Ben Carroll, to our school. Mr Carroll was joined by Member for Clarinda, Mr Heang Tak, along with myself, Miss Ziebell, Mrs Borland and School Captains; **Rodoshi** and **Amy**.

The visit was an exciting opportunity to showcase the outstanding work happening across our school. Discussions centred around:

- Our Master Planning journey

- The innovative Clarinda PS Data Wall
- Evidence-based Phonics Instruction
   across Foundation to Year 2.



Mr Carroll was impressed by our purposeful learning environments, particularly the Gallery space, which demonstrated the immediate need and exciting potential for future Capital Works.

A highlight of the visit was the opportunity to observe our Foundation students engaged in high-quality phonics instruction—an area of focus that is already having a powerful impact on early literacy development. Mr Carroll noted the professional dedication of our staff in bringing the Victorian Curriculum to life in engaging and meaningful ways. Ms Lolas' vibrant Art program and Mr Wells' dynamic Music program brought an extra layer of colour and joy to the visit. These specialist programs showcased the breadth of experiences available to our students, further enriching their learning journey.

I was incredibly proud of our school community—of our youngest learners and their positive attitude, of our passionate educators, and of the calm, welcoming tone that defines Clarinda PS. Mr Carroll remarked on the warm, inclusive culture that was immediately evident across every learning space.

## Respectful Behaviour within the School Community

When parents, carers and school staff work together as one team, our students do better. Everyone at school, particularly staff and parents/carers, play a role in making school a better place for learning and work.

Parents, carers and school staff have a relationship that can last many years. This is an opportunity to work together to create a positive relationship in the best interests of your child. When this relationship is built on respect and trust, students learn better and feel like they belong in the school.

Every member of our school community has a right to feel safe and be protected.

The department's <u>Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy</u> describes the positive behaviour expected from parents, carers, and other adults in Victorian school communities. The policy sets clear standards of behaviour to create a safe, respectful, and inclusive learning environment for students, staff and adults.

There are also resources to support safe and respectful relationships in our school community, including information about getting involved in the school, advice on how to raise a concern or complaint, and parenting support resources. You can

## **Planning Week**

In the week beginning Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> June, staff have been working together throughout the week to plan and organise teaching and learning activities for Term 3. While the teachers are planning, the students will be supervised by the specialist staff and will participate in a variety of specialist sessions. The normal curriculum for this week will not be affected.

## **CYBER SAFETY**

As we move into the mid-year break, I would like to highlight the unwanted and unacceptable uses of social media that is more readily available, particularly during the holidays.

While we understand parents need to attend to work commitments and other duties, it is most important to monitor your child's computer/mobile phone usage at all times.

At a student forum this year, we had Victoria Police present about the dangers of social media on young people and the strategies that can put in place to help children behave responsibly when online. One piece of advice was for parents to limit the time that their children are allowed on various platforms throughout the day. Another piece of advice was for parents to be 'friends' with their children on platforms their children are using so that you can monitor what your child is doing. There is no right or wrong with this, but we are asking parents to please keep an eye on your child and what they are doing when they are online.

At the moment, TIK TOK seems to be the main issue and the age rating is 13+. Yet many of our users are not 13.

All we can do is keep asking parents to support us as we try and educate the children on cybersafety.

## What does it mean to be safe online?

Behaving safely online means:

- · Protecting one's own privacy and personal information.
- · Protecting the privacy of others (this can be sharing personal information or images, which in most cases is unlawful).
- · Selecting appropriate spaces to work. The home computer should be set up in the kitchen area or somewhere common. Not laptops tucked away in bedrooms.
- · Being proactive in letting someone know if there is something that is "not quite right". At home this would be a parent or guardian, at school, a teacher.
- · Ensuring there are suitable malware/anti-virus programs on your computer Of course, these principles of safety and responsibility are not specific to the web, applying to the use of the internet both at home and at school.

## SCHOOL READINESS PARENT INFORMATION SESSION

For parents of children starting Year 7 in 2026

### WHAT WILL THE INFORMATION SESSION COVER?

The session (run by an occupational therapist and speech pathologist) will cover key developmental areas essential for high school readiness, including:

- Executive functioning and organisation: Building strategies for planning and prioritising tasks, goal setting, managing time effectively, staying on task, and using tools such as timetables, checklists, and planners, managing transitions between classes and handling multiple subjects and homework deadlines.
- Emotional regulation and self-advocacy: Recognising and managing emotions, develop coping strategies for stress
  and respond appropriately to setbacks, identifying when they need help, how to communicate their needs to
  teachers or peers, and how to access availables supports.
- Independence and daily living skills: Developing routines for getting ready and arriving at school on time, managing belongings such as lockers, uniforms, and supplies, packing and organising school bags, navigating the school
- Communication and social interaction: Skills for effective classroom participation, asking and answering questions understanding and following instructions, and engaging in respectful peer interactions, perspective taking, conflict resolution and forming positive peer relationships.
- Fine motor and gross motor skills: Supporting the development of handwriting and typing skills, along with physical
  coordination to move safely around the school and take part in sporting and playground activities.

Parents will also learn how to foster these skills at home and recognise when additional support may be needed.
