From the Principal's Desk...

connection and engagement teachers and students share together and have valued.

For our staff the holidays were a time to rest after a very intense term, as I encouraged them to focus on rejuvenating in preparation for the semester ahead. Term 3 is proving to be exceptionally busy with whole school activities: next month's Book Week, 100 days of school celebrations for Foundation, Father's Day stall, Gr 1/2 Camp and some of the other main events scheduled, it is important to regularly check our new Calendar Magnets and Compass News Feed so that you can plan for and prepare your child for upcoming events.

Student Safety

Our commitment to student safety remains paramount. I would like to extend my gratitude to our dedicated staff who diligently uphold Occupational Health & Safety standards to ensure a secure environment for all. As a part of our annual schedule, our teachers complete numerous LearnEd Modules, focusing on essential areas such as Protecting Children - Reporting and Other Legal Obligations. Each area of the school prominently displays Evacuation Plans and Emergency Procedures, ensuring readiness in case of any unforeseen event – with an Lockdown drill scheduled later this term to ensure everyone is familiar with the protocols.

Staffing Update

Our school staff is no different to any other workplace, as we manage planned and unplanned absences. At CPS we're fortunate a regular pool of known Casual Relief Teachers (CRTs) who are available for both short term or longer term replacement. This term we are grateful to have Mrs Cristina Amalfitano backfilling the role of Mr K until late August.

I would also like to inform the community of Ms Pam Pashos' short term redeployment to Kingston Health PS. Ms Pashos will be returning to work on a casual basis at Kingston Heath PS before an impending return to CPS.

NAPLAN

Having this week received our Year 3 & 5 NAPLAN test results, our School Improvement Team (leadership members) Dearnne Backhouse, Elena Ziebell, Elley Borland and myself will be diagnostically using the reports to look for any gaps in our curriculum delivery. At CPS we use school-based data sets to identify whether the NAPLAN reports correlate with other individual assessments so that we can consider our resourcing of additional assistance. This week a number of intervention programs commenced: Rose Cook supporting the Chaplaincy Program; Cally Richardson facilitating the Tutor Learning Inititative; Indra and Amy providing Speech Pathology services and 6 EdConnect staff mentoring students within the school. These programs are designed to complement the teacher's differentiated classroom program, with the selected students withdrawn in 1:1 or small groups for these programs (usually doing so for a term depending on how much catching up they need to do).

Child Safety

Recent media coverage of incidents in the childcare sector serves as a timely reminder of the importance of robust child safety practices. At Clarinda Primary School, the safety and wellbeing of our students is our highest priority. We uphold a strong commitment to the <u>Child Safety Standards</u>, with rigorous recruitment processes in place. All staff must be registered with the Victorian Institute of Teaching, and we require current Working with Children Checks (WWCC) for anyone working or volunteering in our school.





During this term, I'm going to share different ways parents can show their children that they are loved. Telling them is just one way, but other "love languages" are also available to communicate to our children how much we love them.

By speaking your child's own "love language", you can fill her/his emotional tank with love. When your child feels loved, she/he is much easier to care for than when the emotional tank is running near empty.

There are 5 main ways children speak and understand emotional love from parents including: physical touch, words of affirmation, quality time, gifts, and acts of service.

The first one, physical touch, refers to any kind of physical contact parents have with their children – from hugging and kissing to a gentle touch on the back, arm or shoulder. Physical touch is one of love's strongest voices, so all children need this expression of love.

Try some of these this week!

- Hug your child every day when they leave or return from school.
- If your child is under stress, gently stroke their head to relax them. Rub their back when they are upset over a difficult day.
- Snuggle closely together on the couch when watching TV together
- Sing action songs together that require touching and action, such as dancing around holding hands, spinning, jumping.
- Occasionally yell out "Group hug!" for your family or to add more fun, include the dog or cat.
- When your child is sick or gets hurt, spend extra time holding them or bringing comfort


