From the Principal's Desk...

Industrial Action Update

With negotiations continuing between unions and the Victorian Government regarding the next Victorian Government Schools Agreement (VGSA), there has been positive progress on key workforce issues. At this stage, planned action for the 21st May is still scheduled.

As a member of the Australian Principals Federation (APF), we support the teachers and ES at CPS who are now represented by the Australian Education Union (AEU). A central focus of industrial negotiations with the Victorian government is the growing workload of teachers and the need for sustainable conditions that will attract and retain staff in the profession.

Like many schools across Victoria, schools continue to face increasing pressures including workforce shortages, rising workloads, and the growing complexity of supporting student learning and wellbeing. We acknowledge the incredible work of our teaching staff, who consistently go above and beyond to support every student through high-quality teaching, wellbeing support, communication with families, and extracurricular opportunities.

We thank our supportive School Council and parent community as we continue to work together to achieve the best outcomes for our students while also supporting staff wellbeing. We are incredibly proud of the dedication and commitment shown by the Clarinda Primary School team each and every day.

From the Principal's Desk...

Curriculum Contributions

Thank you to all the families who have paid the 2026 Curriculum Contributions. Your support is greatly appreciated.

It is our ongoing aim to provide the highest standards of education to all Clarinda PS students. An important component of a quality education is making sure that we provide a high standard of resources and learning materials. We believe that our students deserve this, and we know that it makes a difference in the outcomes that they achieve.

To achieve the highest standards of teaching and learning our teachers and support staff need quality resources and materials, and we need the support of our school community to achieve this. Whilst we do get some funding from the Department of Education most of it is used to pay for our utilities – electricity/gas/water, relief teaching, plumbing, electrical work, photocopying, furniture, first aid equipment, cleaning consumables, rubbish removal and professional development. This leaves only a small amount to support learning in the standard curriculum.

To provide the high standard we believe our students deserve we ask our parents for a moderate parental contribution (previously known as school fees). Let me reassure you that parental contributions are spent on student learning and curriculum resources & materials. The Department of Education has a strict rule that we must call them voluntary financial contributions, but we simply cannot fund the items we want for our students without your help.

Here are some of the enhancements made possible through the generous support of families in 2026. Just think what would be possible if we had more resources to use.

- Stationary resources
- \$10 000 worth of Decodable Readers to support Phonics and Reading
- \$30 000 leasing program for laptops and iPads across the school for students
- Enrich the specialist program with equipment for STEM, PE, Greek, Art and Music

Kiss and Go Zone Process

1. Stay in sequence

Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, as far forward as possible. This allows vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.

2. Curbside Entry and Exit

ALL children must enter and exit a vehicle from the curbside under no circumstances should this be from the driver's side!

3. Driver duty of care

Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone. Use your indicator to advise when moving into or out of the zone.

4. Strictly No U-turns

Do not do U-turn in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk.

Teaching speaking and listening skills are crucial for our children to be able to interact in their everyday lives.

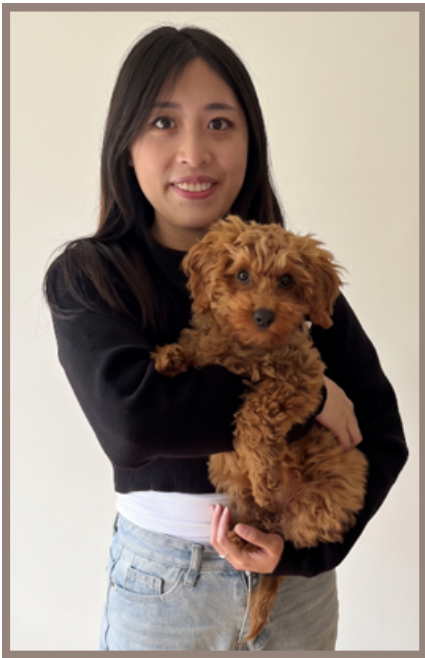
Daily conversations with children are vital for developing language skills, building emotional intelligence, strengthening trust, and boosting academic performance. These interactions increase vocabulary, model social interaction, and foster empathy. Consistent engagement enhances brain connectivity and provides security.

Key benefits of daily communication with children include:

- **Brain Development & Language Skills:** Talking with children, including singing and active listening, helps them learn vocabulary and understand language structures.
- **Emotional Intelligence & Self-Confidence:** Discussing feelings helps children manage emotions, resolve conflicts, and develop empathy.
- **Relationship Building & Trust:** Regular, focused communication builds a strong bond and sense of security.
- **Academic Success:** Early language skills, fostered through conversation, directly correlate to better literacy and future academic achievement.
- **Social Skills:** Children learn conversational turn-taking, nonverbal cues, and social interaction rules, aiding their ability to make friends.

First up we have Ioanna's piece -

'Lorelai's Story'

On July 22nd 1983, a baby girl's story begins.

 I freeze, searching my brain.
 Trying to find an answer.
 But...I can't.
 It's as if nothing does matter to me.
 "Lorelai?" She says.
 "I uhm." I pause, "I don't really know.." My voice quietens, turning to a whisper.
 I shiver not that it's cold, but that this pain is too much.

October 21st 1999, I find the love of my life.
 He's like the key to my heart,
 fixing all the pieces that have been shattered.
 With just his smile and his laugh,
 my day lightens up.
 It's like I was never broken in pieces,
 Instead it's like he's carefully put me back together again.
 As long as he's here I won't have to feel that pain ever again.
 Lovelovelovelove.
 That is all I feel now.

The next day at school the teacher wanders over to me,
 "Lorelai, what matters to you?"
 "My boyfriend. He is my world!"
 I smile at the thought of him.
 The teacher shakes her head,
 "never get too attached to anyone unless they feel the same towards you,
 because one-sided expectations can mentally destroy you."
 I just nod, but of course he feels the same way towards me!
 He would never leave me.
 I keep thinking about what the teacher said over and over again,
 What if she's right?
 I shake myself out of those thoughts.
 She is wrong.

July 22nd 2000,
My 17th Birthday.
I skip down the school halls, with the biggest smile on my face.
I come across one of the empty classrooms,
and I see Alex.
Kissing another girl..
I stand there for what feels like hours trying to process what I'm seeing.
Until they stop,
"Lorelai," Alex calls out.
I slowly back away, shaking my head.
Tears at the urge of dropping.
I start to run as tears drop from my eyes,
how could he do this to me?
Hatehatehatehatehate.
That is all I feel now.

At home.
Tears fall from my eyes,
one after the other,
I sob into my pillow, trying to find out why.
I hate him.
But in reality I know that isn't true,
I miss him.
I miss the way he would hold me in his arms as I cried.
I miss the way he would brighten up my day with just his smile.

Now that I've graduated high school,
I realise that pain doesn't last forever.
There will always be things in the way, challenges to overcome.
But what matters is that I keep pushing.
That is what matters to me.

Office News – Water Safety Program

Clarinda Primary School will be offering a fully subsidized 3-day Water Safety Program for all students in Term 3. The school will subsidise the tuition/instruction fees & transport costs for every child and every session.

Program Dates:

Wednesday 15th July – Finishes Friday 17th July.

Parent Action Items:

- Complete the Monash Questionnaire (paper copy sent home) regarding your child's swimming experience and return the form to school by **Wednesday 20th May**.
- Consent on Compass by **Wednesday 20th May**.
- All students attending the program in 2026 will be supplied with a free blue swimming cap with the Clarinda Primary School logo. These caps will be distributed by class teachers on **Monday 13th July**.
- As attendance numbers need to be reported to the pool and the bus company, late enrolments are unable to be accepted.

Parent help at the Pool

Due to Child Safety Standards, only Prep parents will be permitted to assist with drying and changing their own child after the session. Parents of students in other year levels can attend as spectators but must not enter the change areas.

Prep parents assisting their student in the change rooms must hold a current Working with Children Check. Please present your card to the school office prior to the program commencing and ensure you carry it with you while attending the swimming program.

Every day during the program your child will need to bring to school their swimming clothes in a named waterproof bag along with a towel, blue swimming cap, thongs and swimming goggles. Please spend some time with your child prior to the swimming days, practicing how to pack their swimming bag.

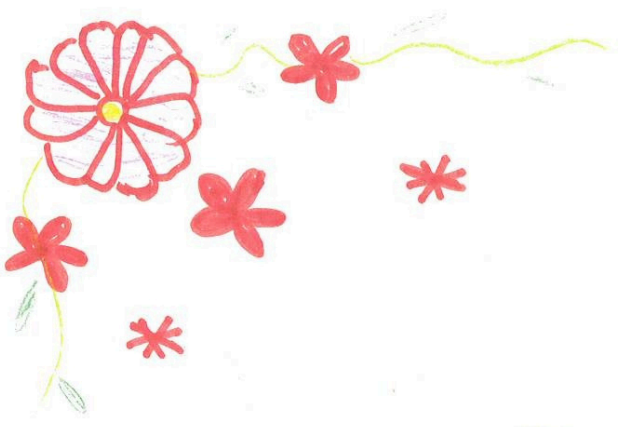
